When Michael informed the Session that we would be writing a piece for Alive based on the month we were Elder of the Month, a little part of me did a blank!

Just what was I going to write??? I focused on two themes in my mind- one music oriented, the other women oriented. (hold on gentlemen- it isn't going the way it might sound)...Women of the Bible.

Now it isn't a big secret that I love to quilt, and there is a quilt that is called Women of the Bible! I have been reading the passages and looking at the blocks- knowing that there are too many quilts and too little time for me to do all of the quilts I love. But reading the history behind these blocks is very interesting.

I'd like to share Mary Magdalene block with you. Now what do you know about Mary Magdalene? Maybe this information is part historical fiction, however parts of it are not.

Mary Magdalene was a prominent woman traveling with a group of women, together with the disciples, following Jesus. Separate companion groups were not uncommon at the time. Mary was the leader of the women's group, while Peter was the leader of the men. Mary joined the group when Jesus cured her of an unknown illness. Some accounts indicate that Mary Magdalene was a former prostitute, but these claims have been found to be untrue. She was, most likely, a woman from a prominent family with considerable resources. She and the other women in the group used their own financial resources to help support Jesus and his followers. Mary was present throughout the final days of Jesus life, death and resurrection. During his crucifixion, the disciples fled; it was too dangerous to remain near Jesus. But Mary Magdalene and a few other women stayed as close to Jesus as possible.

Jesus died on a Sabbath day, and the women were unable to buy the burial spices needed, so they returned to the tomb the following day, and discovered that Jesus' body was missing. Inside the tomb were two angels dressed in white. The women began weeping, thinking that Jesus' body had been stolen. Mary Magdalene begged the angels to tell her where they had taken Jesus. "Saying this, she turned round and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her: "Mary". She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabboni!" which means Teacher. (John 20:14-16.)

Mary Magdalene was the first witness to Jesus' resurrection. Some historians have suggested that maybe Mary and Jesus were "involved" but she greeted Jesus with a term that would have been used by his disciples. Jesus had great regard for Mary and trusted her to report his resurrection to the disciples. All accounts of the crucifixion and death of Jesus describe the women who were present, indicating Mary Magdalene was prominent among these women.

Some times, in our busy lives, we are gifted with an uncommon friendship: someone we can trust implicitly and can count on to stand by us through thick and thin. Mary Magdalene held this uncommon friendship with Jesus. She must have been an incredible woman. Do you share an uncommon friendship with somebody? I do, and I hope you do as well.

## Session Notes

The Session of the First United Presbyterian Church of Salem held a regular meeting Wednesday evening, June 24, 2015 at the church chapel.

Michael Barron, CRE called the meeting to order at 7:00 and opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the May 20th meeting were APPROVED as presented.

The **treasurer's report** was ACCEPTED as presented. Will Linendoll finished the outdoor wiring project. We were able to purchase and fill ALL our fuel tanks at the cost of \$2.30 per gallon (an extremely low price) and are set for the start of winter. We will be asking the congregation to assist with collecting one pound coffee cans to hold cookies for the Thanksgiving baskets that are distributed through the food pantry.

**Clerk's report:** Two new members were welcomed during the Fifth Sunday worship. Building use requests came from Salem Lunch & Learn for July 23-24 during the preparations for the Alfresco Dinner at the Courthouse. Diane Jilek also requested use to institute an adult craft day in the chapel one per month.

**Building & Grounds Task Force:** Still awaiting the report from AllPro. Will look into other items that can be completed on the outside while we wait for the inside to have the mold removed.

**Mission Team:** Monies were issued from the Deacons Ruth Wright fund for a children's project, Salem Summer Lunch & Learn program. Mission team will match the amount collected by children in VBS "Kid-to-Kid" project. Discussed looking into helping children attend Camp Erin; a camp for children who had lost a loved one. Annual pig roast will be October 17th.

**Worship and Music Committee** - Will continue the Community Hymn Sings throughout the summer. Will hold on the second Sunday of the month at 3 pm. Michael will contact the pastors to help promote in their congregations.

**Restoration Committee** - Looking to move forward by contacting Peter Bell to complete a survey in preparation of the outdoor drainage to be completed.

**Pastoral Care & CRE Report** - Rev. David Simmons reported conversations between 20-30 persons, sent cards, phone calls, and home visits totaling around 50 contacts. Completed home communion to four people; including a visit with Bert Moore. Preparing a Bible study on Paul's letter to the Romans that will begin July 15th. Michael reported participation in the Memorial Day services, Fifth Sunday and Community Hymn sing, led the Baccalaureate, attended the Presbytery meeting in Silver Bay and completed one pastoral care call. Michael will have vacation on July 12 and Aug. 23rd and we will look at alternatives for worshipping those days.

Other items discussed were the accepting, with regret, the resignation from Kevin Baylor, preparing for Holly Keys maternity leave, discussion of Fifth Sunday results and preparing for the next Fifth Sunday worship, Looking at two specific questions: "What makes this church unique in the neighborhood or what makes this church different from the other churches in the village?" and "What kind of person does your congregation want to send out into the world?" Decided and agreed to not meet as a Session during July and August but left it open to meet if a need arises. Will hold the next meeting September 2 for business and have our joint meeting with the Deacons on Sept. 16.

## Mission Team

The Mission Team met June 15th at Dolores' home. Neal Rea, moderator, opened with passage from the June 15th reading from "God Calling." David Simmons opened with prayer from the Scripture of the Book of Job.

A motion made and carried to donate \$1000 to the Salem Summer Lunch and Learn Program.

Will complete another RADA cutlery order on July 25th.

David will begin a new Bible Study on Romans, July 17th.

The annual Pig Roast will be October 17th, with tickets being sold before the night of the dinner. Discussion was also about adding a flea market or craft fair.

Vacation Bible School will be held the week of July 20-24. This year five committees or groups from the church will provide an evening meal. The Mission team will supply the pizza and cake on Friday. A note that there may be some conflict with the Washington County Band that uses the chapel for practice on Tuesday nights and Lunch and Learn, who needs space on Thursday and Friday because of the large dinner at the courthouse. Amy will check into this with Seth or Herb about Lunch & Learn. The VBS will raise money to provide bibles for children in Thailand in operation "Kid to Kid." Mission Team to supply matching funds for the project.

Discussion on project "Camp Erin" a camp for children who have lost a loved one. Charlie will see Bev Kratzert or Debbie Earthrowl.

Golf tournament for SAVE van - at last meeting we voted to donate \$50

Meeting was closed in prayer in unison saying the Lord's Prayer.

Next meeting will be July 13th at 7 pm. All are invited!
