SESSION HIGHLIGHTS---JUNE 12 MEETING

There are two trees on the church property that need to be removed due to unhealthy conditions that could cause injury with falling limbs.

Motion was made and approved that all counting of offering on Sundays needs to be done on premises. This will involve at least two unrelated people. These measures were approved to bring our church into more appropriate accounting practice and into approved Presbytery guidelines.

Motion was made and approved to award Clara Thetford a \$500 gift for graduation. The balance of the Cecil Plumb Fund will be donated to Lunch Learn and Play for the benefit of children in the community.

Our fire extinguishers are being recharged and/or replaced to keep them current. We are looking for room darkening shades or blinds for the Chapel to be used for movie and DVD presentations. Reorganization of the Chapel closet should be completed very soon.

Goals to be accomplished over the summer include:

Carpet cleaning in the sanctuary, cleaning windows, perhaps getting a dumpster to clean out storage areas, completing the directory, and in general improving storage within the building, and cleaning throughout the building.

A Note From The Pastor

First Step in Revival: Cleaning Up

A dumpster? Why, pastor? What mess? Don't you know that one person's trash is another's treasure?

A dumpster. That was my request of Session, because as I looked around our wonderful church, all I could see was the need to tidy up. Papers here and there. Tissues left behind in the pews. An array of orphaned trinkets placed on benches. I looked around with eyes of someone new and wondered what people might think if they saw what I saw.

Churches are notorious for collecting "things." We are not a unique case. I remember being astonished years ago when the pastor of the Baptist church I was working at invited me to join her on her cleaning rampage one summer. It was then we discovered several closets long forgotten that, when opened, junk tumbled out. While we didn't speak out loud as we worked, by the way we both gingerly picked through the stuff, you could tell we were praying we wouldn't find any skeletons of critters.

While churches are a catch all for things we don't know what to do with, we forget how our facilities look tells a lot about who we are. And so, I requested a dumpster so that we could be brutal in getting rid of all that is cluttering our beautiful church.

You are probably thinking that there are more important things to do this summer to revive the church. What about Vacation Bible School? What about trying to start a youth group? What about...yes, what about these things? While they are priorities and sorely missed, what we need to tackle right now is what I see as a spiritual exercise — cleaning up.

Two pastor friends of agree with my crusade to clean up. Both have led/are leading large churches. They weren't large when they first arrived. The congregations were struggling. And yet, both of my friends (who are in different parts of the country and don't know one another), decided that the first step in revitalization was a phone call to secure a dumpster. As one friend said, "It was a way of emotionally clearing out all that was blocking the congregation from growth. It was an act of showing those that came in they cared about the ministry God entrusted them to."

Both friends continue the cleaning crusade every year, securing a dumpster as a holy act of physically and emotionally making room for the new thing God wants to do among the congregation.

And so, if there isn't enough energy or enough hands to organize a Vacation Bible School this year, I pray there are enough hands to pick up a piece of paper from the pew and throw it out. I, personally, will be tackling the pastor's office. I envision this room to be more than a pastor's office. Once cleared out, I see this room being a small meeting/meditation room. After all, pastors don't need offices these days. Our office is out in the community.

So, church of First United, our first step in revitalization (after PRAYING) is to clean up our building. And was we clean and pick up, do it prayerfully. For this isn't about throwing away junk. It's about creating a wider, more welcoming sacred space for the Spirit to breathe new life into us.

Yes, step one in church growth is, surprise, surprise, getting a dumpster. Who would have thought?

I will keep you posted when the dumpster arrives. And if anyone wants to help me, especially with the transformation of the pastor's office into a mediation/prayer/meeting space, let me know.
