THE KEEPER OF THE PIGS

Have you ever wondered about the origin and development of words or terms which we, as a church community, use freely? Let's consider **STEWARD!** This English word has its origin in medieval Europe. There are two roots to the word: **WARD** - a keeper or one who guards; **STY** - an enclosure for animals, especially swine. (Swine were an important part of wealth in the Middle Ages.) We apply this concept of stewardship to a person or group charged with the general administration of household affairs such as auditing accounts, maintaining property and husbandry. The session members, whom you elected, are charged with managing these tasks for the congregation.

This congregation is blessed with a beautiful church building, an historical landmark in the community. It is our responsibility and we know it is need of care and repair and are working on ways to accomplish this task. However, too many people when they think of stewardship apply the concept only to physical property. Stewardship also encompasses, most importantly, CARE FOR THE CHURCH WHICH IS THE PEOPLE, not just the building. Mission projects, nurturing each other and outreach to the local and global communities must be included in our understanding and execution of stewardship. We are the family of God as stated beautifully in a quote from 1 PETER, iv, 8, 10 *"Above all hold unfailing your love for one another, since love covers a multitude of sins.....As each has received a gift, employ it for one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."* AMEN.

Session Notes

The Session of the First United Presbyterian Church of Salem held a regular meeting Wednesday evening, May 20, 2015 at the church chapel.

Michael Barron, CRE called the meeting to order at 7:00 and opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the April 16th meeting were APPROVED as presented.

The **treasurer's report** was ACCEPTED as presented.

Building & Grounds Task Force: Bid for mowing was awarded to Travis Keys. Willie Linendoll has completed the electrical wiring for the exit lights and everything is now in compliance with the insurance company. Never heard from Quick Response, but AllPro has checked out the basement and stated the mold is not an emergency, but they will take care of the removal, the ash removal and installation of covering the floor. Still waiting for the bid figure.

Clerk's report: Session Minutes book was examined in Greenwich, Saturday, May 16 and approved without exception. Motion made and approved to purchase a fire proof safe for the office to hold Session and other valuable church records. A memorial service for former pastor, Charles Murn was held Sunday, May 17 in our sanctuary. The 4th of July Civil War Fashion Show has been cancelled with a "Thank You" received from the Civil War Re-enactment Committee. Sylvia Graham is elder for June. Fundraiser dinner to benefit the Food Pantry will be held on Halloween, Saturday, October 31.

Mission Team: Discussion of funding available for any child wishing to attend summer camp; Cinco de Mayo dinner raised \$377 for the Restoration & Renovation Fund and \$40 went to Mission. The date for the annual Pig Roast will be either October 10 or 17th, whichever Bob Wilcox has available. Motion made and approved to give \$50 in Hannaford Gift Cards to Senior Meal Site.

Worship and Music Committee - Lenten Lunches and Special services were well attended; a goodly number attended the Easter Sunrise Service, followed by breakfast. Jane Hayden has invited the congregation to worship at Hedges Lake on August 9th; carnations will be distributed on Mother's day; Plans are progressing for Pentecost and "A Community Hymn Sing." We will be hosting the baccalaureate on June 21st.

Restoration Committee - No report

Pastoral Care & CRE Report - David Simmons reported conversation with between 20-30 persons, cards, phone calls, and home visits to about 50. Home visit with communion to Elsie Jackson and Roberta Moore assisted by John Rea, Bible Study on Meaning of Easter; a new bible study to occur later in the summer with Old Testament studies. Fifth Sunday Announcements

Some of the items discussed during worship were:

- Our buildings are in need of repair. The work will be completed in various phases. The first phase is currently underway. Once this phase is completed, the goal being at the end of 2015, this will allow more time for us to work on raising additional funds for other phases.
- The search for a permanent pastor was placed on hold by Presbytery. The repairs, their cost, the fact we will be starting a fundraising campaign, the and the fact that we are a smaller congregation are all considerations for new pastors. Some pastors would not even approach their start of a ministry or continue their ministry with all these items just beginning. This does NOT mean you will never have one again. It means we need to get things started and established before starting the search again.
- The Session has been working diligently to ensure everything is looked at and considered. The Session is looking at how we can afford future leadership; whether we switch to half-time, or yoked, or other opportunities. The cost of a full time pastor is currently out of our price range; a minimum of almost \$70,000 per year (this figure includes all their benefits.)
