My Christmas Gift To All Of You ~ 2015 <3 I Can Do ALL Things Through CHRIST Who Strengthens Me! ~ Phil. 4:13

It began a long time ago, as I was sitting in the chapel at work, praying, as I usually do on my break, when all of a sudden I just said, "God-how much more? How much more do I have to take...to endure? I can't do it anymore God...UNCLE! Enough already!" Christian Nurture Report

Faith Filled Fridays has come back from Christmas break and, boy, have we been busy. In January we once again warmed up the kitchen making cookies for the free community dinner held on Martin Luther King Day. We had a wonderful lesson on tolerance and acceptance and what it means to serve. We not only looked to Martin Luther King as an example but also our own Cal and Millie Chapman. The children created beautiful centerpieces for the dinner as well, featuring colorful paper children holding hands forming a ring into which we set a vase of flowers. The paper children rested atop a triangle featuring quotes on serving others from Martin Luther King and a memorial to Millie Chapman. In February, we focused on bullying, appropriate/inappropriate behavior, and acceptable/unacceptable language, after a not-so-nice incident on our playground. We talked about how negative behaviors can create/sustain negative stereotypes about kids. We compared that to negative stereotypes about the elderly. The conversation flowed into a lesson on stereotypes and being labeled and what that feels like. How do we change possible negative stereotypes about ourselves or others? One way we came up with was through conversation and getting to know someone, learning from someone. It was from this that we introduced our kids to a new pen pal project we are initiating. We came up with a list of people the children could write to from names supplied by the deacons and some others. The kids were not given any information about the person, other than they were much older than the kids themselves. They had to tell a little about themselves and ask questions. The letters have been sent with a note about the project. The kids are eagerly awaiting return letters. They loved this project! The kids also made valentines cards and gifts for their parents and loved ones along with some paper heart decorations for the sanctuary. A couple other projects we will be looking into for March deal with our 4 legged friends and also pediatric cancer patients. We are looking for donations of fleece to make tug toys for a local animal shelter. A note will go out on other donations for the cancer unit when we focus on that topic. Thank you to all who support our kids!

David Simmons, Amy Thetford, Steven Burgess and Dolores Phaneuf. Arna Thibeau was absent. The meeting was opened with prayer and the Feb. 8 reading, "On Me Alone" from the book, God Calling. The following business was addressed.

- * The reports of the Secretary and Treasurer were approved as presented.
- * Dawn Rea is willing to make a plaque to go with the Nativity Set.
- * Amy gave a report on the Free Community Dinner and said that \$135 was collected for the family that was burned out in a fire
- * A motion was made and carried to join with the Shushan Grange on a project, Operation Adopt A Soldier. Items will be collected during the month of March and then taken to Saratoga to be packed and shipped. Dolores will make posters and prepare a list of suggested items.
