Session Notes

The Session of the First United Presbyterian Church of Salem held a regular meeting Thursday evening, April 16, 2015 at the church chapel.

Michael Barron, CRE called the meeting to order at 7:00 and opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the March 26th meeting were APPROVED as presented.

The **treasurer's report** was ACCEPTED as presented.

Treasurer reported a plea of ignorance was sent to Workman's Compensation Board regarding our fine. It is under review. The church approved the Treasurer to put out bids for lawn care with the stipulation, per the insurance company, of verifying workman's compensation coverage from the winning bidder. Books are being audited by a member of session. Seth will contact Willie Linendoll to ensure completion of the emergency lighting and exit signs required by our insurance carrier.

Building & Grounds Task Force reported an inspection was completed regarding a ventilation system for moisture from the basement will need to be looked at by a professional; building committee looked in the attic and the vent thought was present is not and the windows are in need of repair. No response from Quick Response for the mold abatement. David Mears contacted All Pro and they will be out to give complete an assessment and quote on Friday. David Mears will be meeting with them. They continue to do "mouse control."

Clerk's report included Communion served on Easter Sunday by Michael and David Simmons; a communication from our secretary, Holly Keys; building use request for a Cinco de Mayo dinner on Saturday, May 2 to benefit the Building Restoration Fund, with 10% also going towards Mission.

Mission Team reported they were helping with the Cinco de Mayo dinner and sign-up sheet and recipes will be available Sunday; looking into Summer Youth Camps and encouraging parents and grandparents to sign-up interested children with financial aid coming from the Mission Team; Pentecost is May 24th. Team started discussion on the need for a follow-up for people who have been absent from worship, as well as new attendees.

Pastoral Care & CRE Report - Rev. David Simmons reported making several calls and serving Communion, assisted by Elder David Mears, to Elsie Jackson and Roberta Moore. Michael submitted a report showing a very busy month of March with all the Easter activities.

Discussions during the session meeting also included more details regarding the "Fifth Sunday" worship and mailing out a flyer to all people who attend church. Rev. Jerry McKinney continued discussions regarding an updated Mission and Vision statement to assist in obtaining grants to help with restorations and repairs.
