Session Notes

Session met on April 27 with all members present. Much of the meeting was routine, but a few items are important to note.

We are all to be reminded that activities and events need to be entered onto the church calendar in the Chapel. Bible study, Scouts, dinners, special events are all important to schedule. This avoids potential conflicts and enables the scheduling of cleaning.

It was noted that at the last Presbytery meeting there were presentations by a Rabbi and an Imam, who serve their local congregations and also serve as college chaplains in the Albany area. Each expressed thanks that this opportunity to share thoughts and fellowship with Presbytery was offered. Their messages were well received.

The next building project to accomplish some regrading along the sanctuary foundation will be scheduled as contractors are available to work.

As part of an ongoing effort to create an Operations Manual for this church, the duties of Elders was revised. Committee responsibilities will be the next to be revised and updated.

There will be a meeting with a representative from the Committee on Ministry on May 5, to discuss how this church will move forward with ministry.

Christian Nurture

March and April were once again busy months for the kids at FFF, although very short! With vacations, superintendent's day and 'snow' days we only had 2 days in March and 3 days in April! During March the kids made beautiful paper flowers to use as centerpieces when our church hosted the first Lenten Lunch. We tied in a beautiful lesson around the making of these flowers. I forwarded this brief copy to Rev. Debbie Earthrowl who shared it with those gathered and I would love to share it here:

"I had the kids gathered round me and I put a flower together as they watched and listened and questioned. I started by telling them that this flower was going to start with layers of tissue paper, some dark colors, some light. Just like when we look at ourselves, our lives, we see some bright happy moments and some dark, not-so-happy moments. We see some things we love about ourselves and some darker things about ourselves that we'd rather hide between the layers. Once you have your tissue paper layers you'll fold it accordion style flipping the paper up and down, just as in life when we fall and get back up, when we make mistakes and have to correct them. Life is constantly ups and downs, mistakes and corrections and through it all we pray, prayers of thanks and prayers of forgiveness. Once we're done folding, we place a staple right in the center. The staple is like God, right in the center of our heart holding all our layers together, keeping us from falling completely apart. Then we take our chenille stem and we wrap it around the staple to form the stem. Just like when we embrace God, He helps us stand all on our own. Then we look at the ends of our folded paper and trim off the edges, neaten them up. When we take a deep look at ourselves, we can see where there is room to improve. We can trim away the bad habits. "I don't like how I've called other kids nasty names. I'm going to trim that habit away." Then when we're done with all the hard work, we can start peeling apart the layers and lifting them up. Once we take a good look at ourselves and lift it up before God, only then we can see the true beauty that God has created in us and He is in the center of it all, in our heart. We are his creation and we are beautiful."

The kids enjoyed this lesson so much they wanted to make more, so we made some for the Irish Dinner as well, incorporating green, white and orange tissue paper to mimic the colors of the Irish flag. And, as always, the kids got to take the flowers home for their families to enjoy. The kids also created the flowers for the new bulletin board in the hall when they finished their bullying stories.

We also got back into the kitchen and made some pretzels, which we've done with the kids before. They really love that lesson and being we had just been in the season of Lent it seemed appropriate.

The kids created beautiful packets for the Adopt-a-Soldier collection. Each packet contained candy, energy bars, gum and other goodies along with a picture the child drew, a letter to the soldier and an information sheet telling a little bit about the child (what state the child is from, favorite movies, favorite books, hobbies, etc). By the end of the session we had put together 12 packets.

We ended April with a visitor who is currently putting together a book on bullying and wanted the kids to share anonymous stories they had of bullying experiences they had either been a part of or witnessed. So off the kids went to find quiet places to write and reflect.

We have had to put the tug toys for the animal shelter on hold, as we haven't received enough donations of fleece. We are looking for the polartec-type, blanket material. Bolts of it are typically 45" wide, so we would need that length, but each strip only has to be 3-4" wide. We will then be braiding these strips together. So if you have scrap that meets these specs, we'll take it off your hands! Please don't worry about cutting material into strips, as that's what our children can be busy doing! The children also made banners, 'Hosanna', for Palm Sunday services and 'He Is Risen', for Easter services. It was a very busy few weeks!!
