## Session Notes

If anyone knows please make that information available to us. If we do not have that information forthcoming, we may offer it to any member who could use it, in exchange for a donation, or we may offer it for sale, perhaps through Sue Clary. Our goal is to free up some space for a desk (that has been donated) near the phone, and to put some bookcases in that area for a library that will make a variety of books available for borrowing. Any ideas?

Readings for Pentecost not only the familiar include Acts 1 story about the birth of the church, but this year also suggest readings from Numbers 11 about Moses and Israel, fresh from Egypt; problems they encountered. It is actually meant to be a weekend program but we will once again be tweaking it to make it a 5 day morning program. The music is wonderful and the camping theme is just perfect.
